We looked for peace, but no good came; and for a time of health, and behold trouble!

Analysis

This verse captures disappointed hope: 'We looked for peace, but no good came.' The Hebrew *qivvinu leshalom* (קִיּוּנוֹ לְשָׁלוֹם) indicates confident expectation of the false prophets' 'shalom' message (v. 11). 'And for a time of health, and behold trouble!' uses the contrast between *marpeh* (מַרְפֵּה, healing) and *be'atah* (בְּעַתָּה, terror, calamity). The false prophets had promised healing; reality delivered terror. This verse exposes false hope's bitter fruit—those who believed lying prophets discovered too late that their confidence was misplaced. The contrast between expected shalom and experienced *be'atah* represents total reversal of hope.

Historical Context

This lament would characterize Jerusalem's inhabitants during the sieges of 597 and 586 BC. Having been promised by court prophets that God would defend His city and temple, they watched Babylonian armies surround their walls. Lachish Letter IV mentions 'watching for the signals from Lachish'—desperate military communications during Nebuchadnezzar's campaign. The psychological devastation of realized judgment exceeded physical suffering.
