Chapter 19 of 42 \cdot 29 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

Job's Reply: How Long Will You Torment Me?

- ¹ Then Job answered and said,
- ² How long will ye vex my soul, and break me in pieces with words?
- ³ These ten times have ye reproached me: ye are not ashamed that ye make yourselves strange to me.
- ⁴ And be it indeed that I have erred, mine error remaineth with myself.
- ⁵ If indeed ye will magnify yourselves against me, and plead against me my reproach:
- ⁶ Know now that God hath overthrown me, and hath compassed me with his net.
- ⁷ Behold, I cry out of wrong, but I am not heard: I cry aloud, but there is no judgment.
- ⁸ He hath fenced up my way that I cannot pass, and he hath set darkness in my paths.
- ⁹ He hath stripped me of my glory, and taken the crown from my head.
- ¹⁰ He hath destroyed me on every side, and I am gone: and mine hope hath he removed like a tree.
- ¹¹ He hath also kindled his wrath against me, and he counteth me unto him as one of his enemies.

- ¹² His troops come together, and raise up their way against me, and encamp round about my tabernacle.
- 13 He hath put my brethren far from me, and mine acquaintance are verily estranged from me.
- ¹⁴ My kinsfolk have failed, and my familiar friends have forgotten me.
- ¹⁵ They that dwell in mine house, and my maids, count me for a stranger: I am an alien in their sight.
- 16 I called my servant, and he gave me no answer; I intreated him with my mouth.
- My breath is strange to my wife, though I intreated for the children's sake of mine own body.
- ¹⁸ Yea, young children despised me; I arose, and they spake against me.
- ¹⁹ All my inward friends abhorred me: and they whom I loved are turned against me.
- 20 My bone cleaveth to my skin and to my flesh, and I am escaped with the skin of my teeth.
- ²¹ Have pity upon me, have pity upon me, O ye my friends; for the hand of God hath touched me.
- ²² Why do ye persecute me as God, and are not satisfied with my flesh?

- 23 Oh that my words were now written! oh that they were printed in a book!
- 24 That they were graven with an iron pen and lead in the rock for ever!
- 25 For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth:
- $^{\mathbf{26}}$ And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my flesh shall I see God:

- Whom I shall see for myself, and mine eyes shall behold, and not another; though my reins be consumed within me.
- But ye should say, Why persecute we him, seeing the root of the matter is found in me?
- ²⁹ Be ye afraid of the sword: for wrath bringeth the punishments of the sword, that ye may know there is a judgment.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Glory — בַּבוֹד (Kavod)

Glory, weight, honor

The Hebrew **kavod** (בָּבוֹד) literally means 'weight' or 'heaviness,' metaphorically denoting glory, honor, or majesty. God's glory (Shekinah) filled the tabernacle (Exodus 40:34) and temple (1 Kings 8:11).

God — אֱלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Hope — תָקוַה (Tikvah)

Hope, expectation

The Hebrew **tikvah** (תְּקְוֵה) means hope or expectation—confident trust in God's promises. 'Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the LORD his God' (Psalm 146:5).

Judgment — מִשְׁפָּט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפֵּט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Love — אהֶבַה / חֶסֶד (Ahavah / Chesed)

Love / Loyal-love

Hebrew uses **ahavah** (אַהֶּבָה) for love generally, but the covenant term **chesed** (תְּסָד) describes God's steadfast, loyal love—faithful covenant commitment beyond mere emotion.

Redeem — נָאַל (Gaal)

To redeem, act as kinsman-redeemer

The Hebrew **gaal** (נַּאַל) means to redeem or act as kinsman-redeemer (go'el)—buying back family property or relatives. It foreshadows Christ redeeming His people through His blood.

Sin — חַטַאת (Chatta'ah)

Sin, missing the mark

The Hebrew **chatta'ah** (חַפָּאת) means sin—missing the mark of God's standard. It encompasses rebellion, transgression, and falling short of divine holiness.

Wrath — אַף (Aph)

Wrath, anger

The Hebrew **aph** (אף) literally means 'nose' or 'nostrils,' idiomatically expressing wrath or anger —God's righteous indignation against sin. Yet God is 'slow to anger' (Exodus 34:6) and 'abundant in mercy.'
