Eliphaz's Third Speech: Can a Man Be of Use to God?

- ¹ Then Eliphaz the Temanite answered and said,
- ² Can a man be profitable unto God, as he that is wise may be profitable unto himself?
- ³ Is it any pleasure to the Almighty, that thou art righteous? or is it gain to him, that thou makest thy ways perfect?
- ⁴ Will he reprove thee for fear of thee? will he enter with thee into judgment?
- ⁵ Is not thy wickedness great? and thine iniquities infinite?
- ⁶ For thou hast taken a pledge from thy brother for nought, and stripped the naked of their clothing.
- ⁷ Thou hast not given water to the weary to drink, and thou hast withholden bread from the hungry.
- 8 But as for the mighty man, he had the earth; and the honourable man dwelt in it.
- ⁹ Thou hast sent widows away empty, and the arms of the fatherless have been broken.
- 10 Therefore snares are round about thee, and sudden fear troubleth thee;
- ¹¹ Or darkness, that thou canst not see; and abundance of waters cover thee.

- 12 Is not God in the height of heaven? and behold the height of the stars, how high they are!
- ¹³ And thou sayest, How doth God know? can he judge through the dark cloud?
- ¹⁴ Thick clouds are a covering to him, that he seeth not; and he walketh in the circuit of heaven.
- ¹⁵ Hast thou marked the old way which wicked men have trodden?
- ¹⁶ Which were cut down out of time, whose foundation was overflown with a flood:
- ¹⁷ Which said unto God, Depart from us: and what can the Almighty do for them?
- ¹⁸ Yet he filled their houses with good things: but the counsel of the wicked is far from me.
- ¹⁹ The righteous see it, and are glad: and the innocent laugh them to scorn.
- ²⁰ Whereas our substance is not cut down, but the remnant of them the fire consumeth.
- 21 Acquaint now thyself with him, and be at peace: thereby good shall come unto thee.
- ²² Receive, I pray thee, the law from his mouth, and lay up his words in thine heart.
- 23 If thou return to the Almighty, thou shalt be built up, thou shalt put away iniquity far from thy tabernacles.
- ²⁴ Then shalt thou lay up gold as dust, and the gold of Ophir as the stones of the brooks.
- ²⁵ Yea, the Almighty shall be thy defence, and thou shalt have plenty of silver.
- For then shalt thou have thy delight in the Almighty, and shalt lift up thy face unto God.

- ²⁷ Thou shalt make thy prayer unto him, and he shall hear thee, and thou shalt pay thy vows.
- ²⁸ Thou shalt also decree a thing, and it shall be established unto thee: and the light shall shine upon thy ways.
- When men are cast down, then thou shalt say, There is lifting up; and he shall save the humble person.
- ³⁰ He shall deliver the island of the innocent: and it is delivered by the pureness of thine hands.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

God — אֱלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Heaven — שַמיִם (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שְׁמֵּיִם) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

Judgment — מִשְׁפַט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפֶּט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Justify — צַדַק (Tsadaq)

To be righteous, declare righteous

The Hebrew **tsadaq** (צְדַק) means to be righteous or to declare righteous—a legal verdict of innocence. Abraham 'believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness' (Genesis 15:6).

Law — תובה (Torah)

Law, instruction

The Hebrew **Torah** (תוֹכָה) means law or instruction—God's revealed will for His people. The Law includes moral, civil, and ceremonial commandments, revealing God's character and humanity's need for a Savior.

Repent — שׁוּב / נַחַם (Shuv / Nacham)

To turn back, relent

The Hebrew **shuv** (שוב) means to turn or return—a physical turning that represents spiritual redirection back to God. **Nacham** (בַּחַם) conveys grief or relenting, often used of God 'repenting' of judgment.

Righteous — צַדִּיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צְּדִיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צֶּדֶק), meaning righteousness or justice.

Save — יַשַע (Yasha)

To save, deliver, rescue

The Hebrew **yasha** (יָשַׁע) means to save or deliver—rescue from danger or distress. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.' God alone is Savior: 'I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no saviour' (Isaiah 43:11).
