Elihu's Second Speech: God Is Just

- ¹ Furthermore Elihu answered and said,
- ² Hear my words, O ye wise men; and give ear unto me, ye that have knowledge.
- ³ For the ear trieth words, as the mouth tasteth meat.
- ⁴ Let us choose to us judgment: let us know among ourselves what is good.
- ⁵ For Job hath said, I am righteous: and God hath taken away my judgment.
- ⁶ Should I lie against my right? my wound is incurable without transgression.
- 7 What man is like Job, who drinketh up scorning like water?
- ⁸ Which goeth in company with the workers of iniquity, and walketh with wicked men.
- ⁹ For he hath said, It profiteth a man nothing that he should delight himself with God.
- ¹⁰ Therefore hearken unto me, ye men of understanding: far be it from God, that he should do wickedness; and from the Almighty, that he should commit iniquity.
- For the work of a man shall he render unto him, and cause every man to find according to his ways.
- 12 Yea, surely God will not do wickedly, neither will the Almighty pervert judgment.
- Who hath given him a charge over the earth? or who hath disposed the whole world?

- ¹⁴ If he set his heart upon man, if he gather unto himself his spirit and his breath;
- 15 All flesh shall perish together, and man shall turn again unto dust.
- ¹⁶ If now thou hast understanding, hear this: hearken to the voice of my words.
- 17 Shall even he that hateth right govern? and wilt thou condemn him that is most just?
- ¹⁸ Is it fit to say to a king, Thou art wicked? and to princes, Ye are ungodly?
- 19 How much less to him that accepteth not the persons of princes, nor regardeth the rich more than the poor? for they all are the work of his hands.
- In a moment shall they die, and the people shall be troubled at midnight, and pass away: and the mighty shall be taken away without hand.
- ²¹ For his eyes are upon the ways of man, and he seeth all his goings.
- ²² There is no darkness, nor shadow of death, where the workers of iniquity may hide themselves.
- ²³ For he will not lay upon man more than right; that he should enter into judgment with God.
- ²⁴ He shall break in pieces mighty men without number, and set others in their stead.
- ²⁵ Therefore he knoweth their works, and he overturneth them in the night, so that they are destroyed.
- 26 He striketh them as wicked men in the open sight of others;
- ²⁷ Because they turned back from him, and would not consider any of his ways:
- ²⁸ So that they cause the cry of the poor to come unto him, and he heareth the cry of the afflicted.

- When he giveth quietness, who then can make trouble? and when he hideth his face, who then can behold him? whether it be done against a nation, or against a man only:
- ³⁰ That the hypocrite reign not, lest the people be ensnared.
- 31 Surely it is meet to be said unto God, I have borne chastisement, I will not offend any more:
- ³² That which I see not teach thou me: if I have done iniquity, I will do no more.
- 33 Should it be according to thy mind? he will recompense it, whether thou refuse, or whether thou choose; and not I: therefore speak what thou knowest.
- ³⁴ Let men of understanding tell me, and let a wise man hearken unto me.
- ³⁵ Job hath spoken without knowledge, and his words were without wisdom.
- 36 My desire is that Job may be tried unto the end because of his answers for wicked men.
- ³⁷ For he addeth rebellion unto his sin, he clappeth his hands among us, and multiplieth his words against God.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֶלהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Judgment — מִשְׁפַט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפֵּט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Sin — חַטַאת (Chatta'ah)

Sin, missing the mark

The Hebrew **chatta'ah** (חַפָּאת) means sin—missing the mark of God's standard. It encompasses rebellion, transgression, and falling short of divine holiness.

Spirit — רוּחַ (Ruach)

Spirit, wind, breath

The Hebrew **ruach** (רוֹחַ) means spirit, wind, or breath—invisible but powerful. It describes both the Holy Spirit and the human spirit. God's Spirit gives life and empowers His people.

Transgression — פַשַע (Pesha)

Transgression, rebellion

The Hebrew **pesha** (פֶּשַׁע) means transgression or rebellion—willful violation of God's law. It implies deliberate revolt against divine authority: 'he was wounded for our transgressions' (Isaiah 53:5).

Word — דָבַר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דָבֶר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
