Behold, God exalteth by his power: who teacheth like him?

Analysis

Elihu declares: 'Behold, God exalteth by his power: who teacheth like him?' The verb sagav (שָׁגַב, exalteth) means to be high, inaccessible, or exalted. Koach (כֹּחַ, power) denotes strength or might. The rhetorical question 'who teacheth like him' (mi moreh kamohu, מִי מוֹרֶה כְּמֹהוּ) uses moreh (מוֹרֶה), meaning teacher or instructor. Elihu emphasizes God's unique authority as teacher—His power backs His instruction. The verse anticipates God's speeches where creation itself becomes divine curriculum teaching humanity about wisdom, power, and providence.

Historical Context

Ancient Near Eastern wisdom traditions valued human teachers and sages. Elihu transcends this by identifying God as the ultimate teacher whose instruction comes through creation, providence, and direct revelation. The question 'who teacheth like him' prepares for God's pedagogical approach in chapters 38-41—teaching through rhetorical questions about creation rather than propositional statements.
