Or who shut up the sea with doors, when it brake forth, as if it had issued out of the womb?

## Analysis

---

God asks: 'Or who shut up the sea with doors, when it brake forth, as if it had issued out of the womb?' This poetic description of creation's boundaries (sea contained, womb imagery) reveals divine power ordering chaos. Job who questions God's governance wasn't present when God established cosmic order.

## Historical Context

---

Ancient Near Eastern chaos myths featured divine combat with sea monsters. God's rhetorical question asserts His sovereign containment of chaos without combat.

**Genesis 1:9** (Parallel theme): And God said, Let the waters under the heaven be gathered together unto one place, and let the dry land appear: and it was so.

**Jeremiah 5:22** (Parallel theme): Fear ye not me? saith the LORD: will ye not tremble at my presence, which have placed the sand for the bound of the sea by a perpetual decree, that it cannot pass it: and though the waves thereof toss themselves, yet can they not prevail; though they roar, yet can they not pass over it?
