

# Job 39:6

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Whose house I have made the wilderness, and the barren land his dwellings.

## Analysis

---

"Whose house I have made the wilderness, and the barren land his dwellings." God gave wild asses the desert as their habitat—the aravah (אַרָבָה, "wilderness/desert") and melachah (מֶלַחָה, "salt land/barren ground"). What humans consider wasteland, God designed as perfect habitat for these creatures. This reveals divine purpose in every environment. Nothing is truly wasteland in God's design; each ecosystem serves His purposes. The verse challenges human-centered value judgments about creation.

## Historical Context

---

Ancient peoples often viewed deserts as cursed or useless lands. God reveals these serve specific purposes—perfect habitats for certain creatures. This would expand understanding of divine wisdom and providence, showing God wastes nothing in His creation.

**Psalms 107:34** (Parallel theme): A fruitful land into barrenness, for the wickedness of them that dwell therein.
