God Describes Leviathan

- ¹ Canst thou draw out leviathan with an hook? or his tongue with a cord which thou lettest down?
- ² Canst thou put an hook into his nose? or bore his jaw through with a thorn?
- ³ Will he make many supplications unto thee? will he speak soft words unto thee?
- ⁴ Will he make a covenant with thee? wilt thou take him for a servant for ever?
- ⁵ Wilt thou play with him as with a bird? or wilt thou bind him for thy maidens?
- ⁶ Shall the companions make a banquet of him? shall they part him among the merchants?
- ⁷ Canst thou fill his skin with barbed irons? or his head with fish spears?
- ⁸ Lay thine hand upon him, remember the battle, do no more.
- ⁹ Behold, the hope of him is in vain: shall not one be cast down even at the sight of him?
- 10 None is so fierce that dare stir him up: who then is able to stand before me?
- ¹¹ Who hath prevented me, that I should repay him? whatsoever is under the whole heaven is mine.
- 12 I will not conceal his parts, nor his power, nor his comely proportion.
- ¹³ Who can discover the face of his garment? or who can come to him with his double bridle?

- ¹⁴ Who can open the doors of his face? his teeth are terrible round about.
- 15 His scales are his pride, shut up together as with a close seal.
- 16 One is so near to another, that no air can come between them.
- ¹⁷ They are joined one to another, they stick together, that they cannot be sundered.
- 18 By his neesings a light doth shine, and his eyes are like the eyelids of the morning.
- ¹⁹ Out of his mouth go burning lamps, and sparks of fire leap out.
- 20 Out of his nostrils goeth smoke, as out of a seething pot or caldron.
- 21 His breath kindleth coals, and a flame goeth out of his mouth.
- ²² In his neck remaineth strength, and sorrow is turned into joy before him.
- ²³ The flakes of his flesh are joined together: they are firm in themselves; they cannot be moved.
- 24 His heart is as firm as a stone; yea, as hard as a piece of the nether millstone.
- 25 When he raiseth up himself, the mighty are afraid: by reason of breakings they purify themselves.
- ²⁶ The sword of him that layeth at him cannot hold: the spear, the dart, nor the habergeon.
- 27 He esteemeth iron as straw, and brass as rotten wood.
- 28 The arrow cannot make him flee: slingstones are turned with him into stubble.
- 29 Darts are counted as stubble: he laugheth at the shaking of a spear.
- ³⁰ Sharp stones are under him: he spreadeth sharp pointed things upon the mire.
- 31 He maketh the deep to boil like a pot: he maketh the sea like a pot of ointment.
- 32 He maketh a path to shine after him; one would think the deep to be hoary.

- ³³ Upon earth there is not his like, who is made without fear.
- ³⁴ He beholdeth all high things: he is a king over all the children of pride.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Covenant — בְּרִית (Berit)

Covenant, treaty

The Hebrew **berit** (בְּרִית) denotes a covenant—a binding agreement, often ratified by blood sacrifice. God's covenants (Abrahamic, Mosaic, Davidic) structure redemptive history, culminating in the New Covenant.

Heaven — שָׁמֵים (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (מַפַּיִים) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).
