I will not conceal his parts, nor his power, nor his comely proportion.

Analysis

"I will not conceal his parts, nor his power, nor his comely proportion." God promises detailed description of Leviathan—its parts (badav, בָּדָו), power (gevurotav, גְּבוּרוֹתָיו), and proportions (chein erkho, חֵין עֲרָכוֹ, "grace of arrangement"). Even in describing forces beyond human control, God reveals His creative excellence. Leviathan's terrifying power comes packaged with beautiful design. This teaches that even overwhelming aspects of creation display divine artistry, inviting wonder alongside fear.

Historical Context

Ancient descriptions of fearsome creatures often emphasized only threatening aspects. God's inclusion of Leviathan's "comely proportion" taught that even the terrifying displays divine beauty and design. This would expand understanding of God's character—He is artist even in creating powerful forces.
