Analysis

"The sword of him that layeth at him cannot hold: the spear, the dart, nor the habergeon." All weapons—sword (cherev, מֶּכֶּב), spear (chanit, חֲבָּים), dart (masah, מַּסָּה), and armor (shiryon, שִׁלְּיִיוֹן)—prove ineffective. Complete invulnerability demonstrates that human military might cannot overcome what God protects. This teaches that ultimate security and victory depend entirely on divine will, not human weaponry or strategy. No human power can overcome divine protection.

Historical Context

Ancient warfare relied on these weapons—cutting, piercing, and protective technologies. Leviathan's immunity to all taught that human military power has absolute limits. This would comfort those facing overwhelming enemies, reminding them that God's protection exceeds any human attack.
