Job's Reply: How Can Man Be Right Before God?

- ¹ Then Job answered and said,
- ² I know it is so of a truth: but how should man be just with God?
- ³ If he will contend with him, he cannot answer him one of a thousand.
- ⁴ He is wise in heart, and mighty in strength: who hath hardened himself against him, and hath prospered?
- ⁵ Which removeth the mountains, and they know not: which overturneth them in his anger.
- ⁶ Which shaketh the earth out of her place, and the pillars thereof tremble.
- 7 Which commandeth the sun, and it riseth not; and sealeth up the stars.
- ⁸ Which alone spreadeth out the heavens, and treadeth upon the waves of the sea.
- ⁹ Which maketh Arcturus, Orion, and Pleiades, and the chambers of the south.
- 10 Which doeth great things past finding out; yea, and wonders without number.
- 11 Lo, he goeth by me, and I see him not: he passeth on also, but I perceive him not.
- 12 Behold, he taketh away, who can hinder him? who will say unto him, What doest thou?
- ¹³ If God will not withdraw his anger, the proud helpers do stoop under him.

¹⁴ How much less shall I answer him, and choose out my words to reason with him?

- 15 Whom, though I were righteous, yet would I not answer, but I would make supplication to my judge.
- 16 If I had called, and he had answered me; yet would I not believe that he had hearkened unto my voice.
- 17 For he breaketh me with a tempest, and multiplieth my wounds without cause.
- ¹⁸ He will not suffer me to take my breath, but filleth me with bitterness.
- 19 If I speak of strength, lo, he is strong: and if of judgment, who shall set me a time to plead?
- ²⁰ If I justify myself, mine own mouth shall condemn me: if I say, I am perfect, it shall also prove me perverse.
- ²¹ Though I were perfect, yet would I not know my soul: I would despise my life.
- ²² This is one thing, therefore I said it, He destroyeth the perfect and the wicked.
- ²³ If the scourge slay suddenly, he will laugh at the trial of the innocent.
- ²⁴ The earth is given into the hand of the wicked: he covereth the faces of the judges thereof; if not, where, and who is he?
- 25 Now my days are swifter than a post: they flee away, they see no good.
- 26 They are passed away as the swift ships: as the eagle that hasteth to the prey.
- ²⁷ If I say, I will forget my complaint, I will leave off my heaviness, and comfort myself:
- 28 I am afraid of all my sorrows, I know that thou wilt not hold me innocent.
- ²⁹ If I be wicked, why then labour I in vain?
- ³⁰ If I wash myself with snow water, and make my hands never so clean;
- ³¹ Yet shalt thou plunge me in the ditch, and mine own clothes shall abhor me.

- ³² For he is not a man, as I am, that I should answer him, and we should come together in judgment.
- ³³ Neither is there any daysman betwixt us, that might lay his hand upon us both.
- ³⁴ Let him take his rod away from me, and let not his fear terrify me:
- ³⁵ Then would I speak, and not fear him; but it is not so with me.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Believe — אָמַן (Aman)

To believe, trust, be faithful

The Hebrew **aman** (מַמַן) means to believe or confirm—the root of 'Amen.' It conveys firm trust and reliability. Abraham 'believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness' (Genesis 15:6).

God — אַלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֶלהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Heaven — שַׁמֵּים (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שְׁמֵּיִם) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

Judgment — מִשְׁפַט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְּׁפֵט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Justify — צַדַק (Tsadaq)

To be righteous, declare righteous

The Hebrew **tsadaq** (צְּדָק) means to be righteous or to declare righteous—a legal verdict of innocence. Abraham 'believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness' (Genesis 15:6).

Word — דָבַר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (FGP) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
