## The Word Became Flesh

- <sup>1</sup> In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
- <sup>2</sup> The same was in the beginning with God.
- <sup>3</sup> All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.
- <sup>4</sup> In him was life; and the life was the light of men.
- <sup>5</sup> And the light shineth in darkness; and the darkness comprehended it not.
- <sup>6</sup> There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.
- <sup>7</sup> The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all men through him might believe.
- <sup>8</sup> He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light.
- $^{9}$  That was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.
- $^{10}$  He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.
- <sup>11</sup> He came unto his own, and his own received him not.
- <sup>12</sup> But as many as received him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:

- Which were born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God.
- <sup>14</sup> And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.
- <sup>15</sup> John bare witness of him, and cried, saying, This was he of whom I spake, He that cometh after me is preferred before me: for he was before me.
- <sup>16</sup> And of his fulness have all we received, and grace for grace.
- <sup>17</sup> For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.
- <sup>18</sup> No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.

# The Testimony of John the Baptist

- <sup>19</sup> And this is the record of John, when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, Who art thou?
- <sup>20</sup> And he confessed, and denied not; but confessed, I am not the Christ.
- <sup>21</sup> And they asked him, What then? Art thou Elias? And he saith, I am not. Art thou that prophet? And he answered, No.
- Then said they unto him, Who art thou? that we may give an answer to them that sent us. What sayest thou of thyself?
- <sup>23</sup> He said, I am the voice of one crying in the wilderness, Make straight the way of the Lord, as said the prophet Esaias.
- <sup>24</sup> And they which were sent were of the Pharisees.
- <sup>25</sup> And they asked him, and said unto him, Why baptizest thou then, if thou be not that Christ, nor Elias, neither that prophet?
- $^{26}$  John answered them, saying, I baptize with water: but there standeth one among you, whom ye know not;

- <sup>27</sup> He it is, who coming after me is preferred before me, whose shoe's latchet I am not worthy to unloose.
- <sup>28</sup> These things were done in Bethabara beyond Jordan, where John was baptizing.

# Behold, the Lamb of God

- <sup>29</sup> The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.
- This is he of whom I said, After me cometh a man which is preferred before me: for he was before me.
- <sup>31</sup> And I knew him not: but that he should be made manifest to Israel, therefore am I come baptizing with water.
- <sup>32</sup> And John bare record, saying, I saw the Spirit descending from heaven like a dove, and it abode upon him.
- <sup>33</sup> And I knew him not: but he that sent me to baptize with water, the same said unto me, Upon whom thou shalt see the Spirit descending, and remaining on him, the same is he which baptizeth with the Holy Ghost.
- <sup>34</sup> And I saw, and bare record that this is the Son of God.

## **Jesus Calls the First Disciples**

- $^{35}$  Again the next day after John stood, and two of his disciples;
- $^{36}$  And looking upon Jesus as he walked, he saith, Behold the Lamb of God!
- $^{
  m 37}$  And the two disciples heard him speak, and they followed Jesus.
- Then Jesus turned, and saw them following, and saith unto them, What seek ye? They said unto him, Rabbi, (which is to say, being interpreted, Master,) where dwellest thou?
- <sup>39</sup> He saith unto them, Come and see. They came and saw where he dwelt, and abode with him that day: for it was about the tenth hour.

- $^{40}$  One of the two which heard John speak, and followed him, was Andrew, Simon Peter's brother.
- <sup>41</sup> He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ.
- 42 And he brought him to Jesus. And when Jesus beheld him, he said, Thou art Simon the son of Jona: thou shalt be called Cephas, which is by interpretation, A stone.

# Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael

- $^{43}$  The day following Jesus would go forth into Galilee, and findeth Philip, and saith unto him, Follow me.
- <sup>44</sup> Now Philip was of Bethsaida, the city of Andrew and Peter.
- Philip findeth Nathanael, and saith unto him, We have found him, of whom Moses in the law, and the prophets, did write, Jesus of Nazareth, the son of Joseph.
- 46 And Nathanael said unto him, Can there any good thing come out of Nazareth? Philip saith unto him, Come and see.
- <sup>47</sup> Jesus saw Nathanael coming to him, and saith of him, Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile!
- <sup>48</sup> Nathanael saith unto him, Whence knowest thou me? Jesus answered and said unto him, Before that Philip called thee, when thou wast under the fig tree, I saw thee.
- <sup>49</sup> Nathanael answered and saith unto him, Rabbi, thou art the Son of God; thou art the King of Israel.
- <sup>50</sup> Jesus answered and said unto him, Because I said unto thee, I saw thee under the fig tree, believest thou? thou shalt see greater things than these.
- And he saith unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Hereafter ye shall see heaven open, and the angels of God ascending and descending upon the Son of man.

## **HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES**

## **Angel** — ἄγγελος (Angelos)

## Angel, messenger

The Greek **angelos** (ἄγγελος) means angel or messenger. Angels announced Christ's birth (Luke 2:9-14), ministered to Him (Matthew 4:11), and will accompany His return (Matthew 25:31).

## **Baptize** — βαπτίζω (Baptizo)

#### To baptize, immerse

The Greek **baptizo** ( $\beta\alpha\pi\tau(\zeta\omega)$ ) means to dip, immerse, or baptize. Christian baptism symbolizes identification with Christ's death, burial, and resurrection (Romans 6:3-4).

#### **Believe** — πιστεύω (Pisteuo)

#### To believe, trust, have faith

The Greek **pisteuo** (πιστεύω) means to believe or trust—active reliance upon Christ. 'For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish' (John 3:16).

# **Blood** — αἷμα (Haima)

## Blood

The Greek **haima** ( $\alpha \tilde{i} \mu \alpha$ ) denotes blood. Christ's blood 'cleanseth us from all sin' (1 John 1:7), securing 'eternal redemption' (Hebrews 9:12) through His once-for-all sacrifice. Believers have been 'purchased with his own blood' (Acts 20:28).

## Confess — ὁμολογέω (Homologeo)

#### To confess, acknowledge, agree

The Greek **homologeo** (ὁμολογέω) means to say the same thing—agreeing with God about sin or truth. 'If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins' (1 John 1:9).

# **Glory** — δόξα (Doxa)

## Glory, majesty, splendor

The Greek **doxa** ( $\delta\delta\xi\alpha$ ) means glory, splendor, or magnificence—the radiant manifestation of God's perfection. Christ revealed the Father's glory: 'we beheld his glory' (John 1:14).

## **God** — Θεός (Theos)

#### God

The Greek **Theos** ( $\Theta \epsilon \delta \varsigma$ ) refers to deity, used both for the one true God and false gods. Context determines whether it denotes the Father specifically or the Godhead generally.

## **Grace** — χάρις (Charis)

#### Grace, favor

The Greek **charis** ( $\chi \acute{\alpha} \rho \iota \varsigma$ ) denotes unmerited divine favor—God's kindness toward the undeserving. Salvation is 'by grace through faith' (Ephesians 2:8), not human merit.

## **Heaven** — οὐρανός (Ouranos)

#### Heaven, sky

The Greek **ouranos** (οὐρανός) denotes heaven—God's throne and the believer's eternal home. Jesus taught His disciples to pray 'Our Father which art in heaven' (Matthew 6:9) and promised to prepare a place there (John 14:2).

## **Holy** — ἄγιος (Hagios)

#### Holy, sacred, set apart

The Greek **hagios** (ἄγιος) denotes holiness—moral purity and separation unto God. Believers are called 'saints' (hagioi), those set apart for God through Christ's sanctifying work.

## **Lamb** — ἀμνός / ἀρνίον (Amnos / Arnion)

#### Lamb

The Greek **amnos** (ἀμνός) means lamb. John declared Jesus 'the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world' (John 1:29). In Revelation, Christ is the slain Lamb (arnion) who alone is worthy to open the scroll.

## Law — νόμος (Nomos)

#### Law

The Greek **nomos** ( $\nu$ ó $\mu$ o $\varsigma$ ) denotes law—particularly the Mosaic law. While believers are not under law but under grace (Romans 6:14), Christ fulfilled the law (Matthew 5:17) and wrote it on believers' hearts (Hebrews 8:10).

## **Lord** — Κύριος (Kurios)

#### Lord, Master

The Greek **Kurios** (Κύριος) means 'lord' or 'master,' used both for human masters and divinely for God the Father and Jesus Christ. Its application to Jesus affirms His deity, as it translates YHWH in the Septuagint.

#### **Priest** — ἱερεύς (Hiereus)

#### Priest

The Greek **hiereus** (ἰερεύς) means priest. Christ is our eternal High Priest (Hebrews 4:14) after the order of Melchizedek, and believers form a 'royal priesthood' (1 Peter 2:9).

## **Prophet** — προφήτης (Prophētēs)

#### **Prophet**

The Greek **prophētēs** (προφήτης) denotes a prophet—one who speaks forth God's message. Jesus was recognized as 'a prophet mighty in deed and word' (Luke 24:19), fulfilling and surpassing the prophetic office.

## Sin — ἀμαρτία (Hamartia)

#### Sin, missing the mark

The Greek **hamartia** (ἀμαρτία) means sin—missing the target of God's perfection. 'All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God' (Romans 3:23), requiring Christ's atoning sacrifice.

## **Spirit** — πνεῦμα (Pneuma)

## Spirit, wind, breath

The Greek **pneuma** ( $\pi\nu\epsilon\tilde{\nu}\mu\alpha$ ) means spirit, wind, or breath—the immaterial aspect of persons. The Holy Spirit (Pneuma Hagion) is the third person of the Trinity, dwelling in believers.

## **Word** — λόγος (Logos)

## Word, reason, message

The Greek **Logos** (Λόγος) means word, reason, or message—the rational principle underlying reality. John identifies Christ as the eternal Logos: 'In the beginning was the Word' (John 1:1).
