I pray for them: I pray not for the world, but for them which thou hast given me; for they are thine.

Analysis

I pray for them (ἐρωτῶ περὶ αὐτῶν, erōtō peri autōn)—Christ makes explicit the scope of His high-priestly intercession. The verb erōtaō indicates intimate request between equals, used elsewhere only of the Son addressing the Father. This is not generic prayer but covenant advocacy.

I pray not for the world (οὐ περὶ τοῦ κόσμου ἐρωτῶ)—the κόσμος here means the rebellious system opposed to God, not individual sinners whom Christ came to save (3:16). This verse delimits the scope of His present priestly prayer, not His redemptive work. He intercedes specifically for **them which thou hast given me** (ῶν δέδωκάς μοι)—the elect given by the Father before the foundation of the world. The perfect tense dedokas emphasizes completed action with ongoing results: these belong irrevocably to Christ. **For they are thine** (σοί είσιν)—divine election is ultimately the Father's sovereign choice, executed through the Son's redemptive work.

Historical Context

Spoken in the upper room on Passover night (AD 30), hours before Christ's arrest. This is the culmination of the "high priestly prayer" (John 17), where Jesus intercedes for His disciples before going to the cross. The distinction between "the world" and "those given to me" reflects Jewish covenant theology—God chose Israel from among the nations, and now Christ speaks of the new covenant community.

Additional Cross-References

Hebrews 9:24 (Parallel theme): For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, which are the figures of the true; but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God for us:
