Then said Jesus unto him, Except ye see signs and wonders, ye will not believe.

Analysis

Jesus' rebuke 'Except ye see signs and wonders, ye will not believe' addresses not just the nobleman but the Galileans generally. This critiques sign-dependent faith while also testing the nobleman's trust. True faith believes Christ's word apart from visible evidence. The Reformed tradition emphasizes that faith is 'the evidence of things not seen' (Hebrews 11:1).

Historical Context

This statement recalls Jesus' commendation of those who believe without seeing (John 20:29). The Galileans' welcome based on witnessed miracles (v. 45) exemplifies the sign-seeking mentality Jesus challenges.

Additional Cross-References

Hebrews 2:4 (Parallel theme): God also bearing them witness, both with signs and wonders, and with divers miracles, and gifts of the Holy Ghost, according to his own will?

John 20:29 (Faith): Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

1 Corinthians 1:22 (Parallel theme): For the Jews require a sign, and the Greeks seek after wisdom:
