Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Did not Moses give you the law, and yet none of you keepeth the law? Why go ye about to kill me?

Analysis

The Jews' question 'Where is thy Father?' reveals spiritual blindness - they cannot recognize that Jesus speaks of God. Christ's response shows that knowing Him is knowing the Father, demonstrating the Son's perfect revelation of God. This Johannine theme (14:9) establishes that Christ is the full and final revelation of God's nature and character.

Historical Context

Jesus teaches in the temple treasury (v. 20), the Court of Women where offering boxes stood. This public setting emphasizes the boldness of His claims before religious authorities.

Additional Cross-References

John 1:17 (Word): For the law was given by Moses, but grace and truth came by Jesus Christ.

Matthew 12:14 (Parallel theme): Then the Pharisees went out, and held a council against him, how they might destroy him.

John 7:1 (Parallel theme): After these things Jesus walked in Galilee: for he would not walk in Jewry, because the Jews sought to kill him.

John 11:53 (Parallel theme): Then from that day forth they took counsel together for to put him to death.
