Analysis

'Then again called they the man that was blind, and said unto him, Give God the praise: we know that this man is a sinner.' The phrase 'Give God the praise' demands truthful testimony while simultaneously telling him what conclusion to reach. They 'know' Jesus is a sinner—predetermined conclusion seeking confirmation. Religious authority attempts to override personal experience with institutional verdict.

Historical Context

'Give God the praise' was a formula used when requiring honest testimony (Joshua 7:19). Yet they're dictating the answer while demanding honesty. This contradiction exposes their bad faith. They want the man to deny his experience to support their conclusion.

Additional Cross-References

John 9:16 (Resurrection): Therefore said some of the Pharisees, This man is not of God, because he keepeth not the sabbath day. Others said, How can a man that is a sinner do such miracles? And there was a division among them.
