As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.

Analysis

'As long as I am in the world, I am the light of the world.' This repeats the claim from 8:12. Jesus' physical presence on earth is a period of illumination. His departure wouldn't end the light (believers become light—Matthew 5:14) but changes its expression. While He's bodily present, He is the Light directly. The healing of a blind man demonstrates this—the Light brings sight to those in darkness.

Historical Context

This chapter dramatically illustrates the light/darkness theme. A man born in darkness receives sight from the Light. Meanwhile, those who claim to see prove spiritually blind (verse 41). The reversal exposes true and false sight.

Acts 26:23 (Light): That Christ should suffer, and that he should be the first that should rise from the dead, and should shew light unto the people, and to the Gentiles.

Malachi 4:2 (Parallel theme): But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall.
