Then she let them down by a cord through the window: for her house was upon the town wall, and she dwelt upon the wall.

Analysis

Rahab letting spies down by a cord through her window in the wall demonstrates practical faith. Her wall-house location providentially facilitated their escape.

Historical Context

This verse appears in the Jordan crossing narrative, one of Joshua's most significant events demonstrating God's power and faithfulness in bringing Israel into the Promised Land.
