And the people came up out of Jordan on the tenth day of the first month, and encamped in Gilgal, in the east border of Jericho.

Analysis

The timing of crossing 'the tenth day of the first month' connects to Passover preparation, linking deliverance themes.

Historical Context

This verse appears in the Jordan crossing narrative, one of Joshua's most significant events demonstrating God's power and faithfulness in bringing Israel into the Promised Land.

John 3:16 — God's love and salvation

Ephesians 2:8 — Salvation by grace through faith

1. How does this passage demonstrate God's faithfulness to His covenant promises?
2. What application does this truth have for your walk with Christ today?

Additional Cross-References

Joshua 5:9 (Parallel theme): And the LORD said unto Joshua, This day have I rolled away the reproach of Egypt from off you. Wherefore the name of the place is called Gilgal unto this day.
