# Mark 15

Chapter 15 of 16 · 47 Verses · Authorized King James Version

### **Jesus Before Pilate**

- <sup>1</sup> And straightway in the morning the chief priests held a consultation with the elders and scribes and the whole council, and bound Jesus, and carried him away, and delivered him to Pilate.
- $^{2}$  And Pilate asked him, Art thou the King of the Jews? And he answering said unto him, Thou sayest it.
- <sup>3</sup> And the chief priests accused him of many things: but he answered nothing.
- <sup>4</sup> And Pilate asked him again, saying, Answerest thou nothing? behold how many things they witness against thee.
- <sup>5</sup> But Jesus yet answered nothing; so that Pilate marvelled.

## **Pilate Delivers Jesus to Be Crucified**

- <sup>6</sup> Now at that feast he released unto them one prisoner, whomsoever they desired.
- <sup>7</sup> And there was one named Barabbas, which lay bound with them that had made insurrection with him, who had committed murder in the insurrection.
- $^{8}$  And the multitude crying aloud began to desire him to do as he had ever done unto them.
- $^{9}$  But Pilate answered them, saying, Will ye that I release unto you the King of the Jews?
- <sup>10</sup> For he knew that the chief priests had delivered him for envy.

- <sup>11</sup> But the chief priests moved the people, that he should rather release Barabbas unto them.
- <sup>12</sup> And Pilate answered and said again unto them, What will ye then that I shall do unto him whom ye call the King of the Jews?
- <sup>13</sup> And they cried out again, Crucify him.
- $^{14}$  Then Pilate said unto them, Why, what evil hath he done? And they cried out the more exceedingly, Crucify him.
- <sup>15</sup> And so Pilate, willing to content the people, released Barabbas unto them, and delivered Jesus, when he had scourged him, to be crucified.

## Jesus Is Mocked by the Soldiers

- $^{16}$  And the soldiers led him away into the hall, called Praetorium; and they call together the whole band.
- $^{17}$  And they clothed him with purple, and platted a crown of thorns, and put it about his head,
- <sup>18</sup> And began to salute him, Hail, King of the Jews!
- $^{19}$  And they smote him on the head with a reed, and did spit upon him, and bowing their knees worshipped him.
- <sup>20</sup> And when they had mocked him, they took off the purple from him, and put his own clothes on him, and led him out to crucify him.

#### The Crucifixion

- <sup>21</sup> And they compel one Simon a Cyrenian, who passed by, coming out of the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to bear his cross.
- $^{22}$  And they bring him unto the place Golgotha, which is, being interpreted, The place of a skull.
- $^{23}$  And they gave him to drink wine mingled with myrrh: but he received it not.

- $^{24}$  And when they had crucified him, they parted his garments, casting lots upon them, what every man should take.
- $^{25}$  And it was the third hour, and they crucified him.
- $^{26}$  And the superscription of his accusation was written over, THE KING OF THE JEWS.
- $^{27}$  And with him they crucify two thieves; the one on his right hand, and the other on his left.
- <sup>28</sup> And the scripture was fulfilled, which saith, And he was numbered with the transgressors.
- <sup>29</sup> And they that passed by railed on him, wagging their heads, and saying, Ah, thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days,
- <sup>30</sup> Save thyself, and come down from the cross.
- $^{31}$  Likewise also the chief priests mocking said among themselves with the scribes, He saved others; himself he cannot save.
- <sup>32</sup> Let Christ the King of Israel descend now from the cross, that we may see and believe. And they that were crucified with him reviled him.

#### The Death of Jesus

- <sup>33</sup> And when the sixth hour was come, there was darkness over the whole land until the ninth hour.
- <sup>34</sup> And at the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eloi, Eloi, lama sabachthani? which is, being interpreted, My God, my God, why hast thou forsaken me?
- $^{35}$  And some of them that stood by, when they heard it, said, Behold, he calleth Elias.
- <sup>36</sup> And one ran and filled a spunge full of vinegar, and put it on a reed, and gave him to drink, saying, Let alone; let us see whether Elias will come to take him down.
- $^{
  m 37}$  And Jesus cried with a loud voice, and gave up the ghost.

- <sup>38</sup> And the veil of the temple was rent in twain from the top to the bottom.
- <sup>39</sup> And when the centurion, which stood over against him, saw that he so cried out, and gave up the ghost, he said, Truly this man was the Son of God.
- <sup>40</sup> There were also women looking on afar off: among whom was Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James the less and of Joses, and Salome;
- <sup>41</sup> (Who also, when he was in Galilee, followed him, and ministered unto him;) and many other women which came up with him unto Jerusalem.

#### **Jesus Is Buried**

- <sup>42</sup> And now when the even was come, because it was the preparation, that is, the day before the sabbath,
- <sup>43</sup> Joseph of Arimathaea, an honourable counsellor, which also waited for the kingdom of God, came, and went in boldly unto Pilate, and craved the body of Jesus.
- <sup>44</sup> And Pilate marvelled if he were already dead: and calling unto him the centurion, he asked him whether he had been any while dead.
- $^{45}$  And when he knew it of the centurion, he gave the body to Joseph.
- $^{46}$  And he bought fine linen, and took him down, and wrapped him in the linen, and laid him in a sepulchre which was hewn out of a rock, and rolled a stone unto the door of the sepulchre.
- $^{\rm 47}$  And Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joses beheld where he was laid.

#### **HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES**

**Believe** — πιστεύω (Pisteuo)

To believe, trust, have faith

The Greek **pisteuo** (πιστεύω) means to believe or trust—active reliance upon Christ. 'For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish' (John 3:16).

**God** — Θεός (Theos)

God

The Greek **Theos** ( $\Theta \epsilon \acute{o} \varsigma$ ) refers to deity, used both for the one true God and false gods. Context determines whether it denotes the Father specifically or the Godhead generally.

**Kingdom** — βασιλεία (Basileia)

Kingdom, reign

The Greek **basileia** (βασιλεία) means kingdom—both the realm ruled and the exercise of royal authority. The 'kingdom of God' is central to Jesus' teaching, representing God's saving rule breaking into history.

**Save** — σώζω (Sozo)

To save, deliver, heal

The Greek  $\mathbf{sozo}$  ( $\sigma\dot{\omega}\zeta\omega$ ) means to save—deliverance from sin, death, and judgment. 'Believe on the Lord Jesus Christ, and thou shalt be saved' (Acts 16:31). The word also encompasses physical healing and spiritual wholeness.
