And if a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.

Analysis

Jesus uses political imagery: 'If a kingdom be divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand.' This self-evident principle applies to all organizations—internal division causes collapse. 'Divided' (μερισθῆναι) means split, fragmented. Jesus' logic is inescapable—self-defeating action ensures destruction. Applied to Satan: if he casts out demons, he destroys his kingdom. Therefore, exorcisms must come from opposing power—God's kingdom overcoming Satan's. This silences opponents while revealing divine authority.

Historical Context

First-century Palestine witnessed numerous failed political movements torn by division—Zealot factions, messianic pretenders, revolutionary groups collapsed through infighting. Roman empire maintained control through divide-and-conquer. Jesus' audience understood political fragmentation's consequences. Application to spiritual realm reveals cosmic conflict underlying history.
