And he saith unto them, Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? to save life, or to kill? But they held their peace.

Analysis

Jesus poses a question exposing twisted priorities: 'Is it lawful to do good on the sabbath days, or to do evil? to save life, or to kill?' The question is profound—refusing to do good when opportunity exists is doing evil; failing to save life when possible is taking life. Jesus establishes moral binary: inaction isn't neutral. The Sabbath's purpose is doing good and preserving life. The irony is devastating: Pharisees plot Jesus' murder (v. 6) while condemning Him for healing! 'They held their peace' (ἔσιώπων) indicates guilty silence. Reformed theology emphasizes law's purpose is love.

Historical Context

Jewish rabbinic tradition debated Sabbath healing. General consensus: save life on Sabbath (pikuach nefesh), but postpone non-emergency healing. Jesus rejects this logic. His question 'to save life or to kill' gains irony from Pharisees plotting His death (v. 6)—violating the sixth commandment while claiming Sabbath zeal. Early Christians emphasized mercy over ritual.
