God brought them out of Egypt; he hath as it were the strength of an unicorn.

Analysis

Balaam continues 'God brought them out of Egypt; he hath as it were the strength of an unicorn.' The 'unicorn' (Hebrew 're'em', likely wild ox) symbolized untamable strength. God's deliverance from Egypt demonstrated His irresistible power on Israel's behalf. This redemptive act formed the foundation of Israel's identity and security—they belonged to the God who broke Pharaoh's power.

Historical Context

The Exodus was Israel's defining moment, establishing God as their Redeemer and King. References to leaving Egypt appear throughout Scripture as assurance of God's faithfulness (Deuteronomy 5:6, Hosea 11:1, Matthew 2:15).

Additional Cross-References

Deuteronomy 33:17 (Parallel theme): His glory is like the firstling of his bullock, and his horns are like the horns of unicorns: with them he shall push the people together to the ends of the earth: and they are the ten thousands of Ephraim, and they are the thousands of Manasseh.

Numbers 24:8 (References God): God brought him forth out of Egypt; he hath as it were the strength of an unicorn: he shall eat up the nations his enemies, and shall break their bones, and pierce them through with his arrows.

Psalms 22:21 (Parallel theme): Save me from the lion's mouth: for thou hast heard me from the horns of the unicorns.

Exodus 20:2 (References God): I am the LORD thy God, which have brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage.

Psalms 92:10 (Parallel theme): But my horn shalt thou exalt like the horn of an unicorn: I shall be anointed with fresh oil.

Exodus 9:16 (Parallel theme): And in very deed for this cause have I raised thee up, for to shew in thee my power; and that my name may be declared throughout all the earth.

Numbers 22:5 (References Egypt): He sent messengers therefore unto Balaam the son of Beor to Pethor, which is by the river of the land of the children of his people, to call him, saying, Behold, there is a people come out from Egypt: behold, they cover the face of the earth, and they abide over against me:
