And the congregation shall deliver the slayer out of the hand of the revenger of blood, and the congregation shall restore him to the city of his refuge, whither he was fled: and he shall abide in it unto the death of the high priest, which was anointed with the holy oil.

Analysis

The manslayer must remain in the refuge city 'until the death of the high priest'—only then could he return home safely. The high priest's death somehow satisfied justice, ending the blood guilt. This typology points powerfully to Christ: His death as our High Priest releases us permanently from guilt, providing complete freedom. Our refuge doesn't restrict but liberates.

Historical Context

The high priest's death marking release date suggests his mediatorial role extended beyond annual atonement. His death affected legal status of homicides throughout Israel. This prefigured how Christ's death changes every believer's legal status before God—from guilty to justified.

Additional Cross-References

Exodus 29:7 (Parallel theme): Then shalt thou take the anointing oil, and pour it upon his head, and anoint him.

Joshua 20:6 (Parallel theme): And he shall dwell in that city, until he stand before the congregation for judgment, and until the death of the high priest that shall be

in those days: then shall the slayer return, and come unto his own city, and unto his own house, unto the city from whence he fled.

Leviticus 21:10 (Parallel theme): And he that is the high priest among his brethren, upon whose head the anointing oil was poured, and that is consecrated to put on the garments, shall not uncover his head, nor rend his clothes;
