

# Proverbs 10:9

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

He that walketh uprightly walketh surely: but he that perverteth his ways shall be known.

## Analysis

---

Integrity provides confident security, while perversion leads to exposure and shame. Walking uprightly means transparency before God and others—nothing to hide or fear being revealed. The perverse person's crookedness will eventually be known, demonstrating that secret sin becomes public shame.

## Historical Context

---

City gates served as courts where hidden matters were exposed and judged. The upright could confidently face public scrutiny, while the perverse dreaded the day of reckoning.

1. What areas of your life would you fear being made public, indicating lack of integrity?
2. How can you cultivate greater transparency and uprightness in all relationships?

**Proverbs 17:20** (Parallel theme): He that hath a froward heart findeth no good: and he that hath a perverse tongue falleth into mischief.

**Proverbs 3:23** (Parallel theme): Then shalt thou walk in thy way safely, and thy foot shall not stumble.
