

Proverbs 11:24

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

There is that scattereth, and yet increaseth; and there is that withholdeth more than is meet, but it tendeth to poverty.

Analysis

Generosity produces increase while withholding results in poverty. This paradox reflects kingdom economics—giving doesn't deplete but multiplies through God's blessing. The principle applies spiritually and materially: those who freely share God's grace receive more, while hoarders spiritually impoverish themselves.

Historical Context

Israel's agricultural laws (gleaning, firstfruits, tithes) institutionalized generosity. Those who gave freely to God and neighbors consistently experienced His provision, while the stingy suffered lack.

Related Passages

Genesis 1:1 — Creation of heavens and earth

Psalm 19:1 — Heavens declare God's glory

1. Where do you see God's blessing following your generous giving?
2. What fears prevent you from giving more freely, and how does this verse address them?

Additional Cross-References

Haggai 1:6 (Parallel theme): Ye have sown much, and bring in little; ye eat, but ye have not enough; ye drink, but ye are not filled with drink; ye clothe you, but there is none warm; and he that earneth wages earneth wages to put it into a bag with holes.

Proverbs 28:8 (Parallel theme): He that by usury and unjust gain increaseth his substance, he shall gather it for him that will pity the poor.
