Proverbs on Wisdom and Folly

- ¹ Whose leveth instruction leveth knowledge: but he that hateth reproof is brutish.
- ² A good man obtaineth favour of the LORD: but a man of wicked devices will he condemn.
- ³ A man shall not be established by wickedness: but the root of the righteous shall not be moved.
- ⁴ A virtuous woman is a crown to her husband: but she that maketh ashamed is as rottenness in his bones.
- ⁵ The thoughts of the righteous are right: but the counsels of the wicked are deceit.
- ⁶ The words of the wicked are to lie in wait for blood: but the mouth of the upright shall deliver them.
- ⁷ The wicked are overthrown, and are not: but the house of the righteous shall stand.
- ⁸ A man shall be commended according to his wisdom: but he that is of a perverse heart shall be despised.
- ⁹ He that is despised, and hath a servant, is better than he that honoureth himself, and lacketh bread.
- 10 A righteous man regardeth the life of his beast: but the tender mercies of the wicked are cruel.
- ¹¹ He that tilleth his land shall be satisfied with bread: but he that followeth vain persons is void of understanding.

- ¹² The wicked desireth the net of evil men: but the root of the righteous yieldeth fruit.
- ¹³ The wicked is snared by the transgression of his lips: but the just shall come out of trouble.
- ¹⁴ A man shall be satisfied with good by the fruit of his mouth: and the recompence of a man's hands shall be rendered unto him.
- ¹⁵ The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise.
- ¹⁶ A fool's wrath is presently known: but a prudent man covereth shame.
- ¹⁷ He that speaketh truth sheweth forth righteousness: but a false witness deceit.
- ¹⁸ There is that speaketh like the piercings of a sword: but the tongue of the wise is health.
- ¹⁹ The lip of truth shall be established for ever: but a lying tongue is but for a moment.
- 20 Deceit is in the heart of them that imagine evil: but to the counsellors of peace is joy.
- ²¹ There shall no evil happen to the just: but the wicked shall be filled with mischief.
- 22 Lying lips are abomination to the LORD: but they that deal truly are his delight.
- 23 A prudent man concealeth knowledge: but the heart of fools proclaimeth foolishness.
- 24 The hand of the diligent shall bear rule: but the slothful shall be under tribute.
- ²⁵ Heaviness in the heart of man maketh it stoop: but a good word maketh it glad.
- 26 The righteous is more excellent than his neighbour: but the way of the wicked seduceth them.

- ²⁷ The slothful man roasteth not that which he took in hunting: but the substance of a diligent man is precious.
- ²⁸ In the way of righteousness is life; and in the pathway thereof there is no death.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Blood — pg (Dam)

Blood

The Hebrew dam (DI) means blood—representing life itself. 'The life of the flesh is in the blood' (Leviticus 17:11), and blood was required for atonement, foreshadowing Christ's sacrifice.

Faith — אֱמוּנַה (Emunah)

Faithfulness, trust

The Hebrew **emunah** (אֵמוּנָה) encompasses both faith and faithfulness—trusting God and being trustworthy. It implies steadfast reliability, as in 'The just shall live by his faith' (Habakkuk 2:4).

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנְי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Love — אַהַבָּה / חֵסֶד (Ahavah / Chesed)

Love / Loyal-love

Hebrew uses **ahavah** (אַהֶּבָּה) for love generally, but the covenant term **chesed** (תְּסָד) describes God's steadfast, loyal love—faithful covenant commitment beyond mere emotion.

Righteous — צַדִּיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַּדִיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צָּדֶק), meaning righteousness or justice.

Transgression — פָשַע (Pesha)

Transgression, rebellion

The Hebrew **pesha** (פָּשַׁע) means transgression or rebellion—willful violation of God's law. It implies deliberate revolt against divine authority: 'he was wounded for our transgressions' (Isaiah 53:5).

Truth — אֶמֶת (Emet)

Truth, faithfulness

The Hebrew **emet** (אֶמֶת) means truth or faithfulness—reliability and conformity to reality. God is true (emet), utterly faithful to His word and character.

Word — דָבַר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דְּבָּר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
