

# Proverbs 14:21

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

He that despiseth his neighbour sinneth: but he that hath mercy on the poor, happy is he.

## Analysis

---

He that despises his neighbor sins, but he that has mercy on the poor, happy is he. Contempt toward neighbors violates love commandment; mercy toward poor brings blessedness. The verse establishes both negative prohibition (don't despise) and positive command (show mercy). Despising neighbors is 'sin' (chata - missing the mark, transgression); mercy brings happiness (ashrey - blessed). Reformed theology sees here both moral obligation and eudaemonic promise - righteousness produces flourishing.

## Historical Context

---

Reflects Torah's extensive provisions for poor (gleaning laws, Jubilee, charity commands). Covenant community was to show mercy mirroring God's mercy to them in Egypt's bondage.

2. How has showing mercy to poor brought blessing you wouldn't otherwise experience?

## Additional Cross-References

**Proverbs 28:27** (Parallel theme): He that giveth unto the poor shall not lack: but he that hideth his eyes shall have many a curse.

**Proverbs 19:17** (Parallel theme): He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the LORD; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.

**Proverbs 17:5** (Parallel theme): Whoso mocketh the poor reproacheth his Maker: and he that is glad at calamities shall not be unpunished.

**Psalms 22:24** (Parallel theme): For he hath not despised nor abhorred the affliction of the afflicted; neither hath he hid his face from him; but when he cried unto him, he heard.

**Psalms 112:5** (Parallel theme): A good man sheweth favour, and lendeth: he will guide his affairs with discretion.

**Psalms 112:9** (Parallel theme): He hath dispersed, he hath given to the poor; his righteousness endureth for ever; his horn shall be exalted with honour.
