The highway of the upright is to depart from evil: he that keepeth his way preserveth his soul.

Analysis

The highway of the upright is to depart from evil: he that keepeth his way preserveth his soul. Mesilat yesharim sur mera (מְסִלַּת יְשָׁרִים סֹר מַעַן), the highway of the upright—departing from evil). Mesillah (מְסִלָּה, highway, raised road) represents the upright person's characteristic path—avoiding evil. Shomer darko shomer nafsho (שָׁמֵר דַּרְכוֹ שָׁמֵר נַפְשׁוֹ, guarding his way guards his soul). Careful living preserves life. The proverb teaches that righteousness isn't passive goodness but active evil-avoidance. Believers must flee temptation (1 Corinthians 6:18, 2 Timothy 2:22) and pursue righteousness (1 Timothy 6:11).

Historical Context

Ancient highways enabled commerce and travel but also brought dangers. Staying on the raised road avoided ditches, marshes, and ambushes. Similarly, the upright's moral highway keeps them safe from evil's dangers. Israel's history showed that departing from God's way brought calamity while keeping it brought life (Deuteronomy 30:15-20). Christ is the way (John 14:6), and walking in Him preserves souls eternally.

1. Is your life characterized by actively departing from evil or merely avoiding obviously bad things?
2. What does 'keeping your way' look like practically in terms of guarding your heart, eyes, relationships?
