

Proverbs 16:2

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

All the ways of a man are clean in his own eyes; but the LORD weigheth the spirits.

Analysis

Human self-assessment is unreliable—we judge our ways pure while God weighs spirits (motives, intents). This exposes self-deception requiring external, objective evaluation by God's word and Spirit. Reformed theology emphasizes total depravity affecting even our self-knowledge, necessitating divine illumination.

Historical Context

Levitical priests weighed offerings to ensure proper portions. God similarly weighs hearts with perfect accuracy, discerning mixed motives humans rationalize away.

Additional Cross-References

Proverbs 21:2 (References Lord): Every way of a man is right in his own eyes: but the LORD pondereth the hearts.

1 Samuel 16:7 (References Lord): But the LORD said unto Samuel, Look not on his countenance, or on the height of his stature; because I have refused him: for the LORD seeth not as man seeth; for man looketh on the outward appearance, but the LORD looketh on the heart.

Proverbs 5:21 (References Lord): For the ways of man are before the eyes of the LORD, and he pondereth all his goings.

Isaiah 26:7 (Parallel theme): The way of the just is uprightness: thou, most upright, dost weigh the path of the just.

Proverbs 16:25 (Parallel theme): There is a way that seemeth right unto a man, but the end thereof are the ways of death.
