Proverbs on Wealth and Poverty

- ¹ Better is the poor that walketh in his integrity, than he that is perverse in his lips, and is a fool.
- ² Also, that the soul be without knowledge, it is not good; and he that hasteth with his feet sinneth.
- ³ The foolishness of man perverteth his way: and his heart fretteth against the LORD.
- ⁴ Wealth maketh many friends; but the poor is separated from his neighbour.
- ⁵ A false witness shall not be unpunished, and he that speaketh lies shall not escape.
- ⁶ Many will intreat the favour of the prince: and every man is a friend to him that giveth gifts.
- All the brethren of the poor do hate him: how much more do his friends go far from him? he pursueth them with words, yet they are wanting to him.
- ⁸ He that getteth wisdom loveth his own soul: he that keepeth understanding shall find good.
- ⁹ A false witness shall not be unpunished, and he that speaketh lies shall perish.
- 10 Delight is not seemly for a fool; much less for a servant to have rule over princes.
- 11 The discretion of a man deferreth his anger; and it is his glory to pass over a transgression.
- 12 The king's wrath is as the roaring of a lion; but his favour is as dew upon the grass.

- 13 A foolish son is the calamity of his father: and the contentions of a wife are a continual dropping.
- ¹⁴ House and riches are the inheritance of fathers: and a prudent wife is from the LORD.
- 15 Slothfulness casteth into a deep sleep; and an idle soul shall suffer hunger.
- He that keepeth the commandment keepeth his own soul; but he that despiseth his ways shall die.
- ¹⁷ He that hath pity upon the poor lendeth unto the LORD; and that which he hath given will he pay him again.
- ¹⁸ Chasten thy son while there is hope, and let not thy soul spare for his crying.
- 19 A man of great wrath shall suffer punishment: for if thou deliver him, yet thou must do it again.
- 20 Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end.
- ²¹ There are many devices in a man's heart; nevertheless the counsel of the LORD, that shall stand.
- ²² The desire of a man is his kindness: and a poor man is better than a liar.
- ²³ The fear of the LORD tendeth to life: and he that hath it shall abide satisfied; he shall not be visited with evil.
- 24 A slothful man hideth his hand in his bosom, and will not so much as bring it to his mouth again.
- ²⁵ Smite a scorner, and the simple will beware: and reprove one that hath understanding, and he will understand knowledge.
- He that wasteth his father, and chaseth away his mother, is a son that causeth shame, and bringeth reproach.

- ²⁷ Cease, my son, to hear the instruction that causeth to err from the words of knowledge.
- An ungodly witness scorneth judgment: and the mouth of the wicked devoureth iniquity.
- ²⁹ Judgments are prepared for scorners, and stripes for the back of fools.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Hope — תָקוַה (Tikvah)

Hope, expectation

The Hebrew **tikvah** (תְּקְוַה) means hope or expectation—confident trust in God's promises. 'Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the LORD his God' (Psalm 146:5).

Judgment — מִשְׁפַט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפַּט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Lord — יָהוַה / אָדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִּ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנְיִ), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Love — אַהְבָה / חֶסֶד (Ahavah / Chesed)

Love / Loyal-love

Hebrew uses **ahavah** (אַהֶּבָּה) for love generally, but the covenant term **chesed** (תְּסָד) describes God's steadfast, loyal love—faithful covenant commitment beyond mere emotion.

Transgression — פָּשַׁע (Pesha)

Transgression, rebellion

The Hebrew **pesha** (פָשַׁשִ) means transgression or rebellion—willful violation of God's law. It implies deliberate revolt against divine authority: 'he was wounded for our transgressions' (Isaiah 53:5).

Wrath — אַף (Aph)

Wrath, anger

The Hebrew **aph** (אַצ) literally means 'nose' or 'nostrils,' idiomatically expressing wrath or anger —God's righteous indignation against sin. Yet God is 'slow to anger' (Exodus 34:6) and 'abundant in mercy.'
