

Proverbs 2:7

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: he is a buckler to them that walk uprightly.

Analysis

God's provision for the righteous: 'He layeth up sound wisdom for the righteous: he is a buckler to them that walk uprightly.' God actively stores ('layeth up') wisdom for His people like treasure reserved for heirs. 'Sound wisdom' (Hebrew: tushiyah, abiding success, practical wisdom) represents effective knowledge for life. The buckler (shield) imagery shows God's protective function—He guards those walking uprightly. This demonstrates covenant faithfulness: God equips and protects His people. Justification (declared righteous) leads to sanctification (walking uprightly) with divine provision.

Historical Context

Ancient Near Eastern kings provided for loyal subjects, storing treasures for distribution to faithful servants. God functions as divine King, provisioning His covenant people. The buckler was a small round shield used in close combat, representing personal divine protection. Proverbs consistently contrasts the righteous (covenant-keepers) with the wicked (covenant-breakers), showing different destinies based on relationship with God.

1. How does God's laying up wisdom demonstrate His active provision for His people's needs before they arise?

Additional Cross-References
