Proverbs About Fools

- ¹ As snow in summer, and as rain in harvest, so honour is not seemly for a fool.
- ² As the bird by wandering, as the swallow by flying, so the curse causeless shall not come.
- ³ A whip for the horse, a bridle for the ass, and a rod for the fool's back.
- ⁴ Answer not a fool according to his folly, lest thou also be like unto him.
- ⁵ Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own conceit.
- ⁶ He that sendeth a message by the hand of a fool cutteth off the feet, and drinketh damage.
- 7 The legs of the lame are not equal: so is a parable in the mouth of fools.
- ⁸ As he that bindeth a stone in a sling, so is he that giveth honour to a fool.
- ⁹ As a thorn goeth up into the hand of a drunkard, so is a parable in the mouth of fools.
- 10 The great God that formed all things both rewardeth the fool, and rewardeth transgressors.
- 11 As a dog returneth to his vomit, so a fool returneth to his folly.
- 12 Seest thou a man wise in his own conceit? there is more hope of a fool than of him.

Proverbs About Sluggards

- 13 The slothful man saith, There is a lion in the way; a lion is in the streets.
- ¹⁴ As the door turneth upon his hinges, so doth the slothful upon his bed.
- ¹⁵ The slothful hideth his hand in his bosom; it grieveth him to bring it again to his mouth.
- The sluggard is wiser in his own conceit than seven men that can render a reason.

Proverbs About Meddlers and Quarrels

- ¹⁷ He that passeth by, and meddleth with strife belonging not to him, is like one that taketh a dog by the ears.
- ¹⁸ As a mad man who casteth firebrands, arrows, and death,
- 19 So is the man that deceiveth his neighbour, and saith, Am not I in sport?
- Where no wood is, there the fire goeth out: so where there is no talebearer, the strife ceaseth.
- As coals are to burning coals, and wood to fire; so is a contentious man to kindle strife.
- ²² The words of a talebearer are as wounds, and they go down into the innermost parts of the belly.
- ²³ Burning lips and a wicked heart are like a potsherd covered with silver dross.
- 24 He that hateth dissembleth with his lips, and layeth up deceit within him;
- When he speaketh fair, believe him not: for there are seven abominations in his heart.

- Whose hatred is covered by deceit, his wickedness shall be shewed before the whole congregation.
- Whoso diggeth a pit shall fall therein: and he that rolleth a stone, it will return upon him.
- A lying tongue hateth those that are afflicted by it; and a flattering mouth worketh ruin.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Believe — אָמַן (Aman)

To believe, trust, be faithful

The Hebrew **aman** (אָמַן) means to believe or confirm—the root of 'Amen.' It conveys firm trust and reliability. Abraham 'believed in the LORD; and he counted it to him for righteousness' (Genesis 15:6).

Hope — תִּקוַה (Tikvah)

Hope, expectation

The Hebrew **tikvah** (תַּקְוָה) means hope or expectation—confident trust in God's promises. 'Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the LORD his God' (Psalm 146:5).

Word — דָבָר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דָּבֶר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
