Authorized King James Version (KJV)

My son, forget not my law; but let thine heart keep my commandments:

Analysis

This verse introduces chapter 3's series of commands for wise living. 'Forget not my law' (תֹּרַתִּי אַל-תִּשְׁכַּח/torati al-tishkach) uses 'torah' (law/instruction) to denote fatherly teaching rooted in God's revealed will. Forgetting is not mere intellectual lapse but functional rejection—living as if the commandments don't matter. The positive complement, 'let thine heart keep my commandments,' employs 'natsar' (נְצָר), meaning guard, preserve, observe carefully. The 'heart' (לֶב/lev) as the center of volition and affection must actively maintain the commandments, not merely the memory. The verse promises blessing for obedience (v.2): 'length of days, and long life, and peace.' This reflects covenant theology where faithfulness to God's commands brings flourishing.

Historical Context

Solomon wrote these instructions as a father to his son, following the ancient Near Eastern tradition of wisdom literature.
