

# Proverbs 3:16

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Length of days is in her right hand; and in her left hand riches and honour.

## Analysis

---

Wisdom personified offers longevity with her right hand and riches/honor with her left. This poetic imagery suggests wisdom's comprehensive benefits - both temporal blessings (long life, wealth, honor) and something even greater (right hand signifies greater value). The asymmetry implies that while wisdom brings material blessings, these aren't its primary value. Eternal life is wisdom's greatest gift, with earthly blessings as secondary benefits.

## Historical Context

---

Ancient imagery of right hand (strength, honor) versus left hand (lesser importance) appears throughout Scripture. This verse promises wisdom brings both categories of blessing, with priority on spiritual/eternal (right hand) while not neglecting temporal/practical (left hand).

1. How do you tend to prioritize temporal blessings (wealth, honor) over eternal blessings?
2. What would change if you pursued wisdom primarily for knowing God rather than for practical benefits?
3. How does Christ embody both the 'length of days' (eternal life) and 'riches and honor' that wisdom offers?

## Additional Cross-References

---

**Proverbs 3:2** (Parallel theme): For length of days, and long life, and peace, shall they add to thee.

**2 Corinthians 6:10** (Parallel theme): As sorrowful, yet alway rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing all things.

**Proverbs 22:4** (Parallel theme): By humility and the fear of the LORD are riches, and honour, and life.
