Chapter 30 of 31 \cdot 33 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

The Words of Agur: I Am Weary, O God

- ¹ The words of Agur the son of Jakeh, even the prophecy: the man spake unto Ithiel, even unto Ithiel and Ucal,
- ² Surely I am more brutish than any man, and have not the understanding of a man.
- ³ I neither learned wisdom, nor have the knowledge of the holy.
- ⁴ Who hath ascended up into heaven, or descended? who hath gathered the wind in his fists? who hath bound the waters in a garment? who hath established all the ends of the earth? what is his name, and what is his son's name, if thou canst tell?
- ⁵ Every word of God is pure: he is a shield unto them that put their trust in him.
- ⁶ Add thou not unto his words, lest he reprove thee, and thou be found a liar.

Four Requests

- ⁷ Two things have I required of thee; deny me them not before I die:
- ⁸ Remove far from me vanity and lies: give me neither poverty nor riches; feed me with food convenient for me:
- ⁹ Lest I be full, and deny thee, and say, Who is the LORD? or lest I be poor, and steal, and take the name of my God in vain.
- 10 Accuse not a servant unto his master, lest he curse thee, and thou be found guilty.

Four Generations of Wicked People

- ¹¹ There is a generation that curseth their father, and doth not bless their mother.
- ¹² There is a generation that are pure in their own eyes, and yet is not washed from their filthiness.
- ¹³ There is a generation, O how lofty are their eyes! and their eyelids are lifted up.
- There is a generation, whose teeth are as swords, and their jaw teeth as knives, to devour the poor from off the earth, and the needy from among men.

Four Insatiable Things

- ¹⁵ The horseleach hath two daughters, crying, Give, give. There are three things that are never satisfied, yea, four things say not, It is enough:
- The grave; and the barren womb; the earth that is not filled with water; and the fire that saith not, It is enough.
- ¹⁷ The eye that mocketh at his father, and despiseth to obey his mother, the ravens of the valley shall pick it out, and the young eagles shall eat it.

Four Wonderful Things

- ¹⁸ There be three things which are too wonderful for me, yea, four which I know not:
- ¹⁹ The way of an eagle in the air; the way of a serpent upon a rock; the way of a ship in the midst of the sea; and the way of a man with a maid.
- ²⁰ Such is the way of an adulterous woman; she eateth, and wipeth her mouth, and saith, I have done no wickedness.

Four Things That Are Unbearable

- 21 For three things the earth is disquieted, and for four which it cannot bear:
- ²² For a servant when he reigneth; and a fool when he is filled with meat;
- ²³ For an odious woman when she is married; and an handmaid that is heir to her mistress.

Four Small but Wise Creatures

- ²⁴ There be four things which are little upon the earth, but they are exceeding wise:
- 25 The ants are a people not strong, yet they prepare their meat in the summer;
- ²⁶ The conies are but a feeble folk, yet make they their houses in the rocks;
- ²⁷ The locusts have no king, yet go they forth all of them by bands;
- ²⁸ The spider taketh hold with her hands, and is in kings' palaces.

Four Stately Things

- 29 There be three things which go well, yea, four are comely in going:
- 30 A lion which is strongest among beasts, and turneth not away for any;
- ³¹ A greyhound; an he goat also; and a king, against whom there is no rising up.
- ³² If thou hast done foolishly in lifting up thyself, or if thou hast thought evil, lay thine hand upon thy mouth.
- ³³ Surely the churning of milk bringeth forth butter, and the wringing of the nose bringeth forth blood: so the forcing of wrath bringeth forth strife.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Blood — DI (Dam)

Blood

The Hebrew **dam** (DI) means blood—representing life itself. 'The life of the flesh is in the blood' (Leviticus 17:11), and blood was required for atonement, foreshadowing Christ's sacrifice.

God — אֱלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Heaven — שַׁמֵּים (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שְׁמֵּיִם) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

Holy — קדוש (Qadosh)

Holy, set apart

The Hebrew **qadosh** (קְּדוֹשׁ) means holy or set apart—separated from common use for God's purposes. God is 'the Holy One of Israel,' utterly distinct from creation in moral perfection.

Lord – יָהוָה / אָדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהוָה), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנַיִי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Word — דָבַר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דָּבֶר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).

Wrath — אף (Aph)

Wrath, anger

The Hebrew **aph** (אַא) literally means 'nose' or 'nostrils,' idiomatically expressing wrath or anger —God's righteous indignation against sin. Yet God is 'slow to anger' (Exodus 34:6) and 'abundant in mercy.'
