Chapter 103 of 150 \cdot 22 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

Bless the Lord, O My Soul

- ¹ Bless the LORD, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name.
- ² Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits:
- ³ Who forgiveth all thine iniquities; who healeth all thy diseases;
- ⁴ Who redeemeth thy life from destruction; who crowneth thee with lovingkindness and tender mercies;
- ⁵ Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's.
- ⁶ The LORD executeth righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed.
- $^{7}\,$ He made known his ways unto Moses, his acts unto the children of Israel.
- $^{\mathbf{8}}$ The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy.
- ⁹ He will not always chide: neither will he keep his anger for ever.
- 10 He hath not dealt with us after our sins; nor rewarded us according to our iniquities.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Covenant — ברית (Berit)

Covenant, treaty

The Hebrew **berit** (בְּרִית) denotes a covenant—a binding agreement, often ratified by blood sacrifice. God's covenants (Abrahamic, Mosaic, Davidic) structure redemptive history, culminating in the New Covenant.

Forgive — סֵלַח / נַשֵּׂא (Salach / Nasa)

To forgive, pardon, lift up

The Hebrew **salach** (סְלַח) is used exclusively of God's forgiveness—divine pardon that only He can grant. **Nasa** (נָשָׁא) means to lift up or carry away, picturing sin being removed.

Heaven — שַׁמֵּים (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שְׁמֵּיִם) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

Holy — קדושׁ (Qadosh)

Holy, set apart

The Hebrew **qadosh** (קְּדוֹשׁ) means holy or set apart—separated from common use for God's purposes. God is 'the Holy One of Israel,' utterly distinct from creation in moral perfection.

Kingdom — מַלכוּת (Malkhut)

Kingdom, reign, royal power

The Hebrew **malkhut** (מַלְכוּת) denotes kingdom or royal rule—the realm and reign of a king. God's kingdom represents His sovereign rule over all creation.

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנֵי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Mercy — רַחֲמִים (Rachamim)

Compassion, mercy

The Hebrew **rachamim** (בַּחָמִים) derives from 'womb' (rechem), suggesting tender, maternal compassion. God's mercies are 'new every morning' (Lamentations 3:23), showing His compassionate nature.

Redeem — נָאַל (Gaal)

To redeem, act as kinsman-redeemer

The Hebrew **gaal** (אַאַ) means to redeem or act as kinsman-redeemer (go'el)—buying back family property or relatives. It foreshadows Christ redeeming His people through His blood.

Righteous — צַדִּיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַדִּיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צֶּדֶק), meaning righteousness or justice.

Sin — חטאת (Chatta'ah)

Sin, missing the mark

The Hebrew **chatta'ah** (חַפָּאת) means sin—missing the mark of God's standard. It encompasses rebellion, transgression, and falling short of divine holiness.

Transgression — פָּשַׁע (Pesha)

Transgression, rebellion

The Hebrew **pesha** (פָשַׁע) means transgression or rebellion—willful violation of God's law. It implies deliberate revolt against divine authority: 'he was wounded for our transgressions' (Isaiah 53:5).

Word — דָבָר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דָּבֶּר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
