

# Psalms 105

Chapter 105 of 150 · 45 Verses · Authorized King James Version

---

## Give Thanks to the Lord

- 1** O give thanks unto the LORD; call upon his name: make known his deeds among the people.
- 2** Sing unto him, sing psalms unto him: talk ye of all his wondrous works.
- 3** Glory ye in his holy name: let the heart of them rejoice that seek the LORD.
- 4** Seek the LORD, and his strength: seek his face evermore.
- 5** Remember his marvellous works that he hath done; his wonders, and the judgments of his mouth;
- 6** O ye seed of Abraham his servant, ye children of Jacob his chosen.
- 7** He is the LORD our God: his judgments are in all the earth.
  
- 8** He hath remembered his covenant for ever, the word which he commanded to a thousand generations.
- 9** Which covenant he made with Abraham, and his oath unto Isaac;
- 10** And confirmed the same unto Jacob for a law, and to Israel for an everlasting covenant:
- 11** Saying, Unto thee will I give the land of Canaan, the lot of your inheritance:
- 12** When they were but a few men in number; yea, very few, and strangers in it.
- 13** When they went from one nation to another, from one kingdom to another people;

**14** He suffered no man to do them wrong: yea, he reproved kings for their sakes;

**15** Saying, Touch not mine anointed, and do my prophets no harm.

**16** Moreover he called for a famine upon the land: he brake the whole staff of bread.

**17** He sent a man before them, even Joseph, who was sold for a servant:

**18** Whose feet they hurt with fetters: he was laid in iron:

**19** Until the time that his word came: the word of the LORD tried him.

**20** The king sent and loosed him; even the ruler of the people, and let him go free.

**21** He made him lord of his house, and ruler of all his substance:

**22** To bind his princes at his pleasure; and teach his senators wisdom.

**23** Israel also came into Egypt; and Jacob sojourned in the land of Ham.

**24** And he increased his people greatly; and made them stronger than their enemies.

**25** He turned their heart to hate his people, to deal subtilly with his servants.

**26** He sent Moses his servant; and Aaron whom he had chosen.

**27** They shewed his signs among them, and wonders in the land of Ham.

**28** He sent darkness, and made it dark; and they rebelled not against his word.

**29** He turned their waters into blood, and slew their fish.

**30** Their land brought forth frogs in abundance, in the chambers of their kings.

**31** He spake, and there came divers sorts of flies, and lice in all their coasts.

**32** He gave them hail for rain, and flaming fire in their land.

**33** He smote their vines also and their fig trees; and brake the trees of their coasts.

**34** He spake, and the locusts came, and caterpillers, and that without number,  
**35** And did eat up all the herbs in their land, and devoured the fruit of their ground.  
**36** He smote also all the firstborn in their land, the chief of all their strength.

**37** He brought them forth also with silver and gold: and there was not one feeble person among their tribes.  
**38** Egypt was glad when they departed: for the fear of them fell upon them.  
**39** He spread a cloud for a covering; and fire to give light in the night.  
**40** The people asked, and he brought quails, and satisfied them with the bread of heaven.  
**41** He opened the rock, and the waters gushed out; they ran in the dry places like a river.  
**42** For he remembered his holy promise, and Abraham his servant.  
**43** And he brought forth his people with joy, and his chosen with gladness:  
**44** And gave them the lands of the heathen: and they inherited the labour of the people;  
**45** That they might observe his statutes, and keep his laws. Praise ye the LORD.

## HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

### Blood — דם (Dam)

Blood

The Hebrew **dam** (דָם) means blood—representing life itself. 'The life of the flesh is in the blood' (Leviticus 17:11), and blood was required for atonement, foreshadowing Christ's sacrifice.

### Covenant — ברית (Berit)

Covenant, treaty

The Hebrew **berit** (בְּרִית) denotes a covenant—a binding agreement, often ratified by blood sacrifice. God's covenants (Abrahamic, Mosaic, Davidic) structure redemptive history, culminating in the New Covenant.

**Eternal** — עַלְמָן (Olam)

Eternal, everlasting

The Hebrew **olam** (עַלְמָן) means eternal or everlasting—time stretching beyond human comprehension. God is the 'everlasting God' (Genesis 21:33), and His covenant love endures forever.

**Heaven** — שָׁמָיִם (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שָׁמָיִם) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

**Holy** — קָדוֹשׁ (Qadosh)

Holy, set apart

The Hebrew **qadosh** (קָדוֹשׁ) means holy or set apart—separated from common use for God's purposes. God is 'the Holy One of Israel,' utterly distinct from creation in moral perfection.

**Judgment** — מִשְׁפָט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפָט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

**Kingdom** — מְלָכָות (Malkhut)

Kingdom, reign, royal power

The Hebrew **malkhut** (מְלָכָות) denotes kingdom or royal rule—the realm and reign of a king. God's kingdom represents His sovereign rule over all creation.

**Law** — תּוֹרָה (Torah)

Law, instruction

The Hebrew **Torah** (תּוֹרָה) means law or instruction—God's revealed will for His people. The Law includes moral, civil, and ceremonial commandments, revealing God's character and humanity's need for a Savior.

**Lord** — אֲדֹנָי / יְהֹוָה (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהֹוָה), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנָי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

**Prophet** — נָבִיא (Navi)

Prophet, spokesman

The Hebrew **navi** (נָבִיא) means prophet—one who speaks God's word to the people. Prophets received divine revelation and declared God's message, often calling Israel to repentance and foretelling future events.

**Word** — דְּבָר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דְּבָר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
