

# Psalms 107:5

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Hungry and thirsty, their soul fainted in them.

## Analysis

---

This verse describes the extremity of need. 'Hungry and thirsty' indicates basic survival needs unmet. 'Their soul fainted in them' (nefesh נפש, soul/life being covered/wrapped/faint) means life force was draining away—they were dying. This describes physical desperation but also spiritual condition: humanity starving and dying without God, the bread of life and living water (John 4:10-14; 6:35). The extremity emphasizes human helplessness apart from God's intervention. We're not merely uncomfortable but dying, which makes rescue urgent and makes grace precious. Only those who recognize desperation cry out for deliverance.

## Historical Context

---

Wandering in wilderness without provisions would have been fatal without intervention. The image recalls Israel's wilderness experience where God provided manna and water. For returning exiles, the journey home through desert regions posed real dangers of hunger and thirst. Spiritually, this depicts humanity's condition without God—dying of spiritual thirst and hunger, needing the salvation only God provides.

## Additional Cross-References
