Chapter 110 of 150 \cdot 7 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

The Lord Says to My Lord

- ¹ The LORD said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.
- ² The LORD shall send the rod of thy strength out of Zion: rule thou in the midst of thine enemies.
- ³ Thy people shall be willing in the day of thy power, in the beauties of holiness from the womb of the morning: thou hast the dew of thy youth.
- ⁴ The LORD hath sworn, and will not repent, Thou art a priest for ever after the order of Melchizedek.
- ⁵ The Lord at thy right hand shall strike through kings in the day of his wrath.
- ⁶ He shall judge among the heathen, he shall fill the places with the dead bodies; he shall wound the heads over many countries.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אָדֹנְי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Priest — פֹהֵן (Kohen)

Priest

The Hebrew **kohen** (מַהַ) denotes a priest—one who mediates between God and people through sacrifices and intercession. Aaron and his descendants served as Israel's priests, foreshadowing Christ the Great High Priest.

Repent — שוב / נַחַם (Shuv / Nacham)

To turn back, relent

The Hebrew **shuv** (שוב) means to turn or return—a physical turning that represents spiritual redirection back to God. **Nacham** (בַּחַם) conveys grief or relenting, often used of God 'repenting' of judgment.

Wrath — אַף (Aph)

Wrath, anger

The Hebrew **aph** (אַף) literally means 'nose' or 'nostrils,' idiomatically expressing wrath or anger —God's righteous indignation against sin. Yet God is 'slow to anger' (Exodus 34:6) and 'abundant in mercy.'
