

# Psalms 119:98

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

Thou through thy commandments hast made me wiser than mine enemies: for they are ever with me.

## Analysis

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**Thou through thy commandments hast made me wiser than mine enemies** (תְּחַכְּמֵנִי מִצְוֹתֶיךָ me'oyevai techakkemeni mitzvotekha)—Divine pedagogy: God's mitzvot (commandments) produce chakam (wisdom, skill). Not merely information but formation—Scripture creates sagacity enemies lack. **For they are ever with me** (כִּי לְעוֹלָם הִיא־לִי ki le'olam hi-li)—Constant companionship, not occasional consultation.

David's wisdom exceeded Saul's military cunning (1 Samuel 18:14); Daniel surpassed Babylonian counselors (Daniel 1:20). True wisdom isn't native intelligence but God-taught discernment. Proverbs 9:10 establishes the foundation: "The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom." The psalmist's advantage isn't IQ but intimacy—walking with Scripture until its categories reshape perception. This is Paul's "mind of Christ" (1 Corinthians 2:16).

## Historical Context

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In Israel, wisdom literature (Proverbs, Job, Ecclesiastes) competed with pagan wisdom traditions—Egyptian Amenemope, Mesopotamian Ahiqar. The psalmist claims Hebrew Scripture surpasses all rivals, a claim validated in Christ, "in whom are hidden all treasures of wisdom and knowledge" (Colossians 2:3).

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**Proverbs 2:6** (Parallel theme): For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge and understanding.

**1 Samuel 18:5** (Parallel theme): And David went out whithersoever Saul sent him, and behaved himself wisely: and Saul set him over the men of war, and he was accepted in the sight of all the people, and also in the sight of Saul's servants.
