They Have Afflicted Me from My Youth

- ¹ Many a time have they afflicted me from my youth, may Israel now say:
- ² Many a time have they afflicted me from my youth: yet they have not prevailed against me.
- ³ The plowers plowed upon my back: they made long their furrows.
- ⁴ The LORD is righteous: he hath cut asunder the cords of the wicked.
- ⁵ Let them all be confounded and turned back that hate Zion.
- ⁶ Let them be as the grass upon the housetops, which withereth afore it groweth up:
- ⁷ Wherewith the mower filleth not his hand; nor he that bindeth sheaves his bosom.
- ⁸ Neither do they which go by say, The blessing of the LORD be upon you: we bless you in the name of the LORD.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנְי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Righteous — צַדִּיק (Tzaddik)

Righteous one

The Hebrew **tzaddik** (צַּדִיק) describes one who is righteous, just, or lawful—conforming to God's standard. From the root tzedek (צָּדָק), meaning righteousness or justice.
