Analysis

That our garners may be full, affording all manner of store: that our sheep may bring forth thousands and ten thousands. Prayer for agricultural abundance—full storehouses, multiplying flocks. Reflects covenant blessing (Deuteronomy 28). Prosperity enables generosity.

Historical Context

Agrarian economy depended on crops and livestock. Full granaries meant security; abundant flocks provided necessities and trade goods.

Additional Cross-References

Deuteronomy 28:4 (Parallel theme): Blessed shall be the fruit of thy body, and the fruit of thy ground, and the fruit of thy cattle, the increase of thy kine, and the flocks of thy sheep.

Deuteronomy 28:8 (Parallel theme): The LORD shall command the blessing upon thee in thy storehouses, and in all that thou settest thine hand unto; and he shall bless thee in the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee.
