Chapter 148 of 150 \cdot 14 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

Praise the Lord from the Heavens

- ¹ Praise ye the LORD. Praise ye the LORD from the heavens: praise him in the heights.
- ² Praise ye him, all his angels: praise ye him, all his hosts.
- ³ Praise ye him, sun and moon: praise him, all ye stars of light.
- ⁴ Praise him, ye heavens of heavens, and ye waters that be above the heavens.
- 5 Let them praise the name of the LORD: for he commanded, and they were created.
- ⁶ He hath also stablished them for ever and ever: he hath made a decree which shall not pass.

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

Angel — מַלְאֶךְ (Mal'akh)

Angel, messenger

The Hebrew **mal'akh** (מֵלְאַרְ) means angel or messenger—a heavenly being sent by God. Angels serve as God's messengers, worship Him, and minister to believers (Hebrews 1:14).

Heaven — שָׁמֵים (Shamayim)

Heaven, sky

The Hebrew **shamayim** (שָׁמֵים) means heaven or sky—God's dwelling place and the realm above earth. 'The heaven, even the heavens, are the LORD's' (Psalm 115:16), yet 'the heaven of heavens cannot contain Him' (1 Kings 8:27).

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהוָה), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנֵי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Word — דָבָר (Davar)

Word, thing, matter

The Hebrew **davar** (דָּבֶּר) means word, thing, or matter—God's creative and authoritative speech. 'By the word of the LORD were the heavens made' (Psalm 33:6).
