Chapter 149 of 150 \cdot 9 Verses \cdot Authorized King James Version

Sing to the Lord a New Song

- ¹ Praise ye the LORD. Sing unto the LORD a new song, and his praise in the congregation of saints.
- ² Let Israel rejoice in him that made him: let the children of Zion be joyful in their King.
- ³ Let them praise his name in the dance: let them sing praises unto him with the timbrel and harp.
- ⁴ For the LORD taketh pleasure in his people: he will beautify the meek with salvation.
- ⁵ Let the saints be joyful in glory: let them sing aloud upon their beds.
- ⁶ Let the high praises of God be in their mouth, and a twoedged sword in their hand;
- 7 To execute vengeance upon the heathen, and punishments upon the people;
- ⁸ To bind their kings with chains, and their nobles with fetters of iron;

HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES

(Kavod) כַבוֹד (Kavod)

Glory, weight, honor

The Hebrew **kavod** (τίς) literally means 'weight' or 'heaviness,' metaphorically denoting glory, honor, or majesty. God's glory (Shekinah) filled the tabernacle (Exodus 40:34) and temple (1 Kings 8:11).

God — אֱלֹהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

Judgment — מִשְׁפַט (Mishpat)

Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מִשְׁפֵּט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

Lord — יהוַה / אָדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (יְהוָהְיִ), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנָי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Salvation — ישועה (Yeshuah)

Salvation, deliverance

The Hebrew **yeshuah** (יְשׁוּשֶׁהְ) means salvation or deliverance—rescue from danger or enemies. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.'
