## May the Lord Answer You in Trouble

- <sup>1</sup> The LORD hear thee in the day of trouble; the name of the God of Jacob defend thee;
- <sup>2</sup> Send thee help from the sanctuary, and strengthen thee out of Zion;
- <sup>3</sup> Remember all thy offerings, and accept thy burnt sacrifice; Selah.
- <sup>4</sup> Grant thee according to thine own heart, and fulfil all thy counsel.
- <sup>5</sup> We will rejoice in thy salvation, and in the name of our God we will set up our banners: the LORD fulfil all thy petitions.
- <sup>6</sup> Now know I that the LORD saveth his anointed; he will hear him from his holy heaven with the saving strength of his right hand.
- $^{7}$  Some trust in chariots, and some in horses: but we will remember the name of the LORD our God.
- <sup>8</sup> They are brought down and fallen: but we are risen, and stand upright.

## **HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES**

God — אֵלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

**Holy** — קדוש (Qadosh)

Holy, set apart

The Hebrew **qadosh** (קַדוֹש) means holy or set apart—separated from common use for God's purposes. God is 'the Holy One of Israel,' utterly distinct from creation in moral perfection.

Lord — יָהוָה / אֵדֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הָּוָה!), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנֵי), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

Save — יַשע (Yasha)

To save, deliver, rescue

The Hebrew yasha (יָשַׁע) means to save or deliver —rescue from danger or distress. This is the root of 'Jesus' (Yeshua), meaning 'YHWH saves.' God alone is Savior: 'I, even I, am the LORD; and beside me there is no saviour' (Isaiah 43:11).
