

# Psalms 21:3

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

For thou preventest him with the blessings of goodness: thou settest a crown of pure gold on his head.

## Analysis

---

The word 'preventest' (KJV) means 'to go before' or 'to anticipate'—God's blessings precede human action, demonstrating prevenient grace. The crown of pure gold symbolizes divine favor and sovereign appointment. From a Reformed perspective, this verse illustrates unconditional election: God's blessings flow from His sovereign choice, not human merit. God initiates, bestows, and establishes—the king receives, not achieves.

## Historical Context

---

The coronation imagery recalls the anointing of Davidic kings. The 'crown of pure gold' signifies both royalty and divine approval. In Solomon's case (1 Kings 1-2), God's choice preceded Solomon's reign, demonstrating sovereign election.

## Additional Cross-References

**2 Samuel 12:30** (Parallel theme): And he took their king's crown from off his head, the weight whereof was a talent of gold with the precious stones: and it was set on David's head. And he brought forth the spoil of the city in great abundance.

**Ephesians 1:3** (Sin): Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ:

**Romans 11:35** (Parallel theme): Or who hath first given to him, and it shall be recompensed unto him again?

**Revelation 19:12** (Parallel theme): His eyes were as a flame of fire, and on his head were many crowns; and he had a name written, that no man knew, but he himself.

**Psalms 18:18** (Parallel theme): They prevented me in the day of my calamity: but the LORD was my stay.

**Job 41:11** (Parallel theme): Who hath prevented me, that I should repay him? whatsoever is under the whole heaven is mine.
