

# Psalm 22:3

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

But thou art holy, O thou that inhabitest the praises of Israel.

## Analysis

---

Even in anguish, the psalmist affirms God's holiness—'thou art holy.' The phrase 'inhabiteth the praises of Israel' (Hebrew: yashav tehillot) means God is enthroned upon or dwells amid His people's worship. Reformed theology sees this as covenant faithfulness: God's character remains constant regardless of circumstances. Suffering doesn't negate God's holiness; rather, holy worship continues even in suffering. This verse models theodicy—affirming God's goodness while experiencing unexplained pain.

## Historical Context

---

Israel's worship life centered on acknowledging God's holiness and praising His covenant faithfulness. Even when suffering exile or oppression, the community continued liturgical praise, trusting God's character over circumstances.
