

Psalm 22:5

Authorized King James Version (KJV)

They cried unto thee, and were delivered: they trusted in thee, and were not confounded.

Analysis

The ancestors' crying and deliverance establishes the pattern: trust + cry = deliverance without shame. The word 'confounded' (bosh) means put to shame or disappointed. God's covenant faithfulness ensures that those who genuinely trust Him will ultimately not be disappointed (Rom. 10:11). This verse anchors present suffering in past precedent, demonstrating that God's track record validates current trust despite present darkness.

Historical Context

Israel's liturgical memory rehearsed God's salvific acts—Passover, Red Sea crossing, entrance into Canaan. These historical deliverances became theological foundations for trusting God in new crises. The past informs the future through present faith.

Romans 10:11 (Faith): For the scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed.

Psalms 106:44 (Parallel theme): Nevertheless he regarded their affliction, when he heard their cry:

Psalms 31:1 (Faith): In thee, O LORD, do I put my trust; let me never be ashamed: deliver me in thy righteousness.

Judges 6:6 (Parallel theme): And Israel was greatly impoverished because of the Midianites; and the children of Israel cried unto the LORD.
