## **Teach Me Your Paths**

- <sup>1</sup> Unto thee, O LORD, do I lift up my soul.
- <sup>2</sup> O my God, I trust in thee: let me not be ashamed, let not mine enemies triumph over me.
- <sup>3</sup> Yea, let none that wait on thee be ashamed: let them be ashamed which transgress without cause.
- <sup>4</sup> Shew me thy ways, O LORD; teach me thy paths.
- <sup>5</sup> Lead me in thy truth, and teach me: for thou art the God of my salvation; on thee do I wait all the day.

### **HEBREW & GREEK WORD STUDIES**

Covenant — ברית (Berit)

Covenant, treaty

The Hebrew **berit** (בְּרִית) denotes a covenant—a binding agreement, often ratified by blood sacrifice. God's covenants (Abrahamic, Mosaic, Davidic) structure redemptive history, culminating in the New Covenant.

**Forgive** — סֶלַח / נַשָּׂא (Salach / Nasa)

To forgive, pardon, lift up

The Hebrew **salach** (סָלַח) is used exclusively of God's forgiveness—divine pardon that only He can grant. **Nasa** (נַשָּׂא) means to lift up or carry away, picturing sin being removed.

God — אֵלהִים (Elohim)

God (plural of majesty)

The Hebrew **Elohim** (אֱלֹהִים) is a plural form denoting majesty and fullness of deity. Though grammatically plural, it takes singular verbs when referring to the one true God, suggesting the Trinity's plurality within unity.

**Iniquity** — עוֹן (Avon)

Iniquity, guilt, punishment

The Hebrew **avon** ( $\mu\nu$ ) encompasses iniquity, guilt, and its punishment—the twisted nature of sin. 'The LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all' (Isaiah 53:6), Christ bearing our guilt and penalty.

## Judgment — מִשְׁפַט (Mishpat)

#### Judgment, justice

The Hebrew **mishpat** (מַשְּפֵט) means judgment or justice—God's righteous decisions and ordinances. God is the Judge of all the earth who 'shall do right' (Genesis 18:25), executing perfect justice.

## Lord — יָהוַה / אֵד'ֹנֵי (YHWH / Adonai)

#### The LORD / Lord

When 'LORD' appears in small capitals, it represents the Tetragrammaton **YHWH** (הְּוָהְיִ,), God's personal covenant name meaning 'I AM.' When 'Lord' appears normally, it's **Adonai** (אֲדֹנְיִ), meaning 'my Lord,' emphasizing sovereignty.

## Mercy — בַחַמִּים (Rachamim)

#### Compassion, mercy

The Hebrew **rachamim** (בַּחָמִים) derives from 'womb' (rechem), suggesting tender, maternal compassion. God's mercies are 'new every morning' (Lamentations 3:23), showing His compassionate nature.

## Redeem — נָאַל (Gaal)

#### To redeem, act as kinsman-redeemer

The Hebrew **gaal** (נַּאַל) means to redeem or act as kinsman-redeemer (go'el)—buying back family property or relatives. It foreshadows Christ redeeming His people through His blood.

## Sin — חַטָּאת (Chatta'ah)

#### Sin, missing the mark

The Hebrew **chatta'ah** (חַפָּאת) means sin—missing the mark of God's standard. It encompasses rebellion, transgression, and falling short of divine holiness.

## Transgression — פָשַע (Pesha)

#### Transgression, rebellion

The Hebrew **pesha** (פָּשַׁע) means transgression or rebellion—willful violation of God's law. It implies deliberate revolt against divine authority: 'he was wounded for our transgressions' (Isaiah 53:5).

#### Truth — אֶמֶת (Emet)

#### Truth, faithfulness

The Hebrew **emet** (אֶמֶת) means truth or faithfulness—reliability and conformity to reality. God is true (emet), utterly faithful to His word and character.
